

# Who Will Lead

## Aneb Jah Rasta Sensas-Utcha Nefer 1 (Independent)

"I'm already the leader. Just gimme the damn house keys to the capitol and let it be!" said Rev. Dr. Aneb Jah Rasta Sensas-Utcha Nefer 1. His name translates to "God's power to heal" and he will be appearing on the Nov. 5 ballot as an independent candidate for Wisconsin State governor. The 34-year-old Milwaukee resident doesn't think he will have a problem securing the vote. "I've already won. I'm already the governor, and the President of the United States of America!"

Aneb Sensas-Utcha was born Billy Joe Perry, the youngest child of a large family. "I grew up in Milwaukee. Nothing was ever easy. We were deprived benefits from the government. We were deprived of health care (and) Medicare. One of my relatives was (severely) beaten by a police officer. So we got a problem. I have experienced it." He attended James Madison High School and holds a Ph.D. in metaphysics from American University of Metaphysical Theology in Minnesota. Metaphysics is the study of abstract ideas.

He has taught at every grade level, from kindergarten to college. He has worked with the Milwaukee schools parental choice program and has opened several churches. He hosts a TV show on cable in Milwaukee called

"If You Love Me, They Hate You", and is working on two unreleased music albums. He currently officiates at high school and adult sports leagues.

Sensas-Utcha originally planned on running for State Assembly, but found it so easy to collect the required 2000 signatures that he decided to try for the highest office in the state. He gathered the signatures himself. "I broke the record for nominations, 7,756 signatures, when some people couldn't even get 2000. I did it all. You can't trust (anyone)," he said.

He knows he would be a good leader for the people of Wisconsin because he has "experienced the things they say they're gonna change, and they have not. How can you help somebody if you have not experienced it?"

"You got people out here scared to help themselves. I worked as a maintenance worker. I had to get up and walk maybe five miles a day to the bus stop. Just to make six bucks an hour, six bucks an hour. And I was terminated from that position because my job was done before everyone else and they couldn't push me anywhere. So they came up with an excuse to get rid of me, because I would say hello to people."

"I have been a victim of everything they're (talking about). I have been a victim. Poisoned, people have

put sorcery on me, witchcraft, voodoo."

His strategy is simple. "Never say what you're gonna do. You attack what is not right, and say you're gonna change everything that is not right. It's common sense, just like the alphabet. The a, the b, the c, the d. You know that's what it's all about. That's the real stuff anyway," he said.

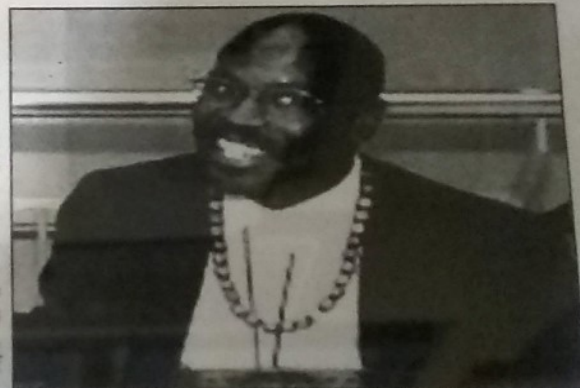
He feels that he is being targeted by the government. "Wherever I appear, they get caught in their failure. They are in the service of corruption."

"I can teach. I can talk shit. But they ain't caring."

Sensas-Utcha sees many problems with our current leaders, "You got various individuals who are in the government who are certified pharmacists. To drug you."

"I follow nobody. That's why I chose to be independent. I could've gone republican or democrat. A republican is a sign of a Hindu elephant. And a democrat is a jackass. The government is going to hell, every republican, every democrat. They're not caring about you."

Sensas-Utcha does not agree with



the tactic of trying to please everyone that is so common in political campaigning. "You can't lie to the motherf\*ckers. You have to win! They can't lie to the people just to get a damn vote! I'm not gonna kiss anybody's ass for a vote. Are you with me?"

"I'm being honest. They can't stand me! Do you see why they don't like me?"

But Sensas-Utcha is not ready to give up if he doesn't receive enough votes to become Wisconsin's leader. "If I don't officially win, I will not stop. I will not quit. And I know you're laughing at me, probably saying this guy's crazy!" When asked if he planned to run for any other office, he replied, "Yes, all of (them). I mean, I'm being honest."
